VII. Subcommittee Reports

a. 911 Communications Subcommittee – Marlys Davis

- AT&T has acquired Cricket, old networks are in the process of being shut down.
- **FCC & Telecom Report November 2014**
 - Refer to handout on OneDrive for information.
- **Interim Text-to-9-1-1**
 - FCC has a text-to-911 PSAP registry. The information is self-reported and it appears that the information is not current or completely accurate.
 - Status tracking sheet (handout) will be tracked at each AC meeting.
 - Maps (handouts) were printed before Marlys' spreadsheet. Please be sure to get your information to Marlys as quickly as possible. King County is about a year away from text-to-911.
- **Telematics Class of Service**
 - Instructions are ready to go out. Linda McKelvey retired, when her replacement Missy Greer is available, and the process is approved, the instructions will be sent out.
 - Wireless and VoIP files
 - Intrado and TCS will be working on their shape files.
- **911 Outages**
 - One in May and one in June, due to maintenance issues. Although planned, there was no notice given. About 33 PSAPs were affected. CenturyLink, Intrado, and the State Office, agreed that all maintenance will cease until a notification/communications plan is fully in place.

- Markus Volke – an update on the CenturyLink plan will be provided to the state office next week.
- Scott McKenzie with CenturyLink – Scott has eight states in his jurisdiction. Preliminary outages used to take between 8 days and 3 weeks. The good news in the recent outages is that Intrado got an alarm of the event at 3:11 am and notified the CenturyLink NOC within 20 minutes. The level of transparency and speed has become better. Information, we see that larger cities are looking for more information while smaller cities are looking for less. We are reviewing going to an opt-in/opt-out situation. Keep giving us feedback, we're working on it. We are working to complete the first NG911 network testing associated with security concerns. We will share information with the state within 3 or 4 months.
 - Peggy Fouts – We received an inquiry about an outage within 5 minutes when we moved to our backup PSAP facility. It is appreciated that improvements are being made.

 - Call if you can, Text if you can't. We are working to get everyone on the same page on this messaging.
 - Regional conference – in March of 2016 Oregon will be hosting the APCO conference and came to our Public Education folks to address co-hosting the Public Education Tract. We will be working with the State Office on this.
 - OneDrive – sharing of information is important so training on OneDrive will take place.

f. GIS Subcommittee – Craig Larsen

- A previous recommendation to the State Office was to purchase servers – a new option is loading the mapping information to OneDrive. Seventeen counties are participating.
- We had a booth at the summer forum, some of the data was reviewed and was well received. It may not meet all of the quality standards of NENA, but is good and moving along.
- Working on a standard schema of all of the 911 data.
- DNR is the standard for county boundaries. If there is a problem, the county will be responsible for contacting DNR.
- Working on how much data is necessary for routing 911 calls.
- A 2-day Workshop is being developed.
- Counties are working on photo imagery from Pictometry, some counties are grouping together to get better pricing.
- *The 911 Communications subcommittee will be moving to the 1st week and the GIS subcommittee will move to the 3rd week.*

VIII. State Office Reports

a. Fiscal Reports – Bill Peters (Refer to handouts)

- In the Governor's budget we asked for \$56 million, plus \$10 million for projects. On maintenance, we had \$49 million which was bumped to \$43 million. Modernization came in at \$5 million instead of the \$10 million requested. The Cardiac Arrest Response pilot is an application for King County, it was proposed by the legislature. It is an application that will alert you if you are able to help with CPR in case there is a heart attack in the area. This has been tasked to Bill Peters to get the application running. Pulse point is the application and it is currently in use in Spokane and Clark County's. It is interfaced with the PSAP's CAD. Expenses include ongoing maintenance costs based on density of population served.
- WSP Criminal history computer upgrade – is a continuance from a project started last year. \$3.23 million will come out of the 911 funds.
- We did not fund a COOP coordinator.
- Okanogan and Ferry county relief; the funds for the radio system upgrade are not coming out of the 911 funding, but the disaster relief fund.
- End of year contract billing– we're able to go back into last year to cover contract costs – our deadline is July 31. We must have them *before* July 31.
- Language Line – That line item is there to cover the cost for a 911 call, period. No other uses, such as follow-ups are covered. Voyance is .62 a minute compared to .97 a minute for Language Line. Language Line is appealing the bid at the state office.
- State office budget as of end of May; we are zeroing out operations contracts for the first time. We should be at 91%, at the end of May we were at 79%, June is generally a high expenditure month, so we should be very close.
- New contracts will be out shortly. We are separating the equipment contract out and it should be approved soon.
- **RFP STATUS ESInet** – Very close to publishing. Waiting on OFM to approve data plan. This will be unlike any RFP nationwide.

- The Department of Health published an RFP 911 solution. It is not for an E911 system. It is to ensure that the ALI data gets to your PSAPs directly. We referred them back to Washington Enterprise Business Systems. Vendors cannot contact OFM directly or they risk losing the business. Anything that has E911 listed in it makes it subject to sweeping E911 funds. The AC suggested the State Office contact OFM over the title of that RFP to hopefully protect our interests.
- **Wireless Carrier Reports** – There is no statutory requirement for vendors to put these reports together for us. We are still working to get this information, it is a huge issue for the carrier in many cases to get the numbers pulled together. We will continue to work on this.

IX. New Business

a. Population Representations 2015 - Peggy Fouts

- Chelan County's population has increased to 75,030 which moves them from Rural A/C representation into Urban. This means that 911 Coordinator Jim Fosse is no longer eligible to fulfill the rural counties east representative position. Mike Worden is the Alternate and will take steps to replace the AC member position.
- Chelan County has moved into Urban Counties East for A/C and Medium Counties East for subcommittee representatives.

b. Committee Chair Appointments – Peggy Fouts

- A list of the current chairs was gathered and were polled regarding their interest in continuing for another year, they all are interested in continuing.
Moved, seconded, and approved; to have chairs continue in their current positions under their respective subcommittees.
- Mission statements – changes will be made and readied for the next AC meeting.
- Member lists – make sure that members are put forward for additions to the list – they must be on the list for reimbursement.
- AC Members – TAG would like a form put together; a checklist of items such as who needs to be a state residents, etc. As no-one has volunteered, Peggy Fouts and JoAnn Boggs will take the lead on this.
