



BIOGRAPHY OF BG ALBERT KAYE

General Kaye began his military career 5 Jun 1939 when he was commissioned a 2LT, CE, ORC. He was ordered to Federal service on 15 Dec 1940, and performed duty at the Engineer Replacement Training Center at Fort Belvoir, Va, and Fort Leonard Wood, Mo. He was appointed to the grade of 1LT, on 9 Apr 1942. In June 1942, he was assigned to the 321st Engineer Bn of the 96th Infantry Division and served as supply officer and executive officer of that unit, both in the CONUS, and the Asiatic-Pacific theater. He was promoted to Captain on 9 Oct 42, and to Major on 29 Dec 45. Upon return to civilian life, he was assigned to the ORC.

On 7 Jul 1947, General Kaye reverted to the grade of Captain and assumed command of the 41st Reconnaissance Troop of the Washington National Guard. On 8 Sep 1950, he was promoted to Major, and assigned as Assistant Chief of staff G2, of the 41st Inf Div. He received his promotion to LTC on 19 Mar 1952. On 5 Jan 61 he became Deputy Bde Commander, 41st Inf Div. He received his promotion to colonel on 20 Jan 61. On 5 Jun 62, he was reassigned as Chief of Staff, 41st Inf Div. He was transferred on 11 Oct 62 to the 2d BG, 161st Inf to assume command. Upon reorganization of the 41st Inf Div under the ROAD concept on 1 Mar 63, he was assigned as commander of the 41st Inf Div Support Command. Then on 25 Oct 65, he was assigned as Assistant Division Commander, 41st Inf Div, in the Washington National Guard. General Kaye received Federal recognition as Brigadier General of the Line on 7 Dec 1965. He assumed command of the 81st Infantry Brigade (Separate) on 1 Jan 1968.
