## **BRIGADIER GENERAL TERRY L. REED**

Brigadier General Terry L. Reed is the Commander, 81st Infantry Brigade (Mechanized).

Brigadier General Reed was born in Bonners Ferry, Idaho on November 25th, 1945. He is a graduate of Eastern Washington State College. He enlisted in the United States Army in March, 1966 and received his commission in the U.S. Army in March, 1967. His military education includes; U.S. Army Officer Candidates School, Infantry Officer's Basic course, Airborne Training, Jump Master Training, Infantry Officer's Advanced Course, Command and General Staff College and the Brigade Command and Battle Staff Course.

Brigadier General Reed served two years on active duty, which included tours with the 82nd Airborne Division, Fort Bragg, North Carolina and the Republic of South Viet Nam and 1st Infantry Division, Fort Riley Kansas. He transferred to the Washington Army National Guard in 1971 assuming the position of Detachment Commander, Headquarters and Headquarters Company, 81st Infantry Brigade followed by the position as Liaison Officer, HHC, 81st Infantry Brigade.

Brigadier General Reed served subsequent positions in the Washington Army National Guard, including: Commander, HHC, 1st Battalion, 161st Infantry; Chief of Training Division, State Area Command; Chief of Staff, HQ, STARC; Commander, 1st Battalion, 161st Infantry; Deputy Commander, 81st Infantry Brigade; and Director of Information Management, HQ, STARC.

Brigadier General Reed's awards and decorations include: the Bronze Star with "V" (for valor) with two oak leaf clusters; The Meritorious Service Medal with two oak leaf clusters; the Air Medal; the Army Commendation Medal with two oak leaf clusters; various Vietnam service awards; the Washington State Legion of Merit; and other active and reserve service medals and ribbons.

Brigadier General Reed resides in Spokane, Washington with his wife Gail and three children; Amanda, Brady and Nick. He is employed by the Spokane Fire Department as the Assistant Fire Chief.

**Civilian Occupation:** Assistant Chief, Spokane Fire Department

Spokane has a population of 180,000 people and covers 57.5 square miles. It is the second largest city in Washington State. The Fire Department has 334 full-time employees located in 14 firestations, an emergency dispatch center, a training center, maintenance shop and administrative offices. It's annual operating budget is in excess of \$23 million dollars. The department provides Fire Suppression, Emergency Medical, Hazardous Material, and Technical Rescue response. The department also provides mutual aid and supplemental response to surrounding fire districts serving over 200,000 additional residents. It also has an active Fire Prevention Bureau and Public Education effort.

The Assistant Chief assumes command of the department when the Chief is absent. The assistant Chief has primary responsibility for Training, Equipment Readiness and Maintenance, and Logistical and Administrative support activities. His duties include performing command and coordination functions at large and significant incidences. He also serves as a member of the Spokane County Regional Incident Command Team; performs Labor Negotiations / Relations activities; and oversees OSHA, Labor and Industries standards and related safety issues.
