The Airman Leadership School Blended Learning Course (ALS BLC) combines distance learning principles with traditional classroom learning. ALS BLC is divided into two phases. Phase One utilizes an online Learning Management System (LMS) as the primary platform for all academic activities. Students can complete academic work at home, work, or on the go. Anywhere they have a computer device and an internet connection can become a potential classroom. Phase II provides opportunities for students to receive the benefits of networking with and learning from other military professionals from throughout the Air Force.

Why ALS BLC? This course was specifically designed with the Air Reserve Component Airmen in mind. ALS BLC combines the proven benefits of facilitated online learning, with the academic experiences and classroom setting of the traditional ALS course. Phase One is six weeks long and affords the student opportunities to interact with their instructor and fellow classmates. All academics during Phase One are delivered in an asynchronous environment; therefore, students are <u>never</u> required to be logged on to the LMS at any specific date or time. Students must meet minimum participation and assignment requirements to ensure they are appropriately involved in the course and are meeting academic standards. Phase Two is conducted over 14 calendar days and provides future leaders opportunities to refine their communication, critical thinking skills and decision making abilities. NCOs are best developed, both personally and professionally, by completing their EPME experience in residence.
