- a. State Enhanced 9-1-1 Coordination Office (SECO) [00:01:19] Adam Wasserman
  - 1) ESInet (Emergency Services IP Network) Transition. Rivercomm and Whitman county successfully transitioned over.   - 1) Communications subcommittee met on 9th of May.

c. Next Generation 9-1-1 (NG9-1-1) [00:07:10]

Katy Myers

1) Presented “Mostly Updated” Washington State NG9-1-1 Plan. Plan supports the grant application process. Asking AC (Advisory Committee) Committee to adopt the plan. Ms. Myers asks committee members to please read the first three pages which are the Executive Summary. If you do adopt this plan, it includes three or four important items, these are as follows:

- Vision for NG9-1-1- Service is accessible to all. Takes advantage of latest communication technologies, and provides the vital link between the public and emergency services. Three goals support the vision.
  - ✓ Implement a system of technology, guidelines, training, support, and policies that allow seamless reporting of information via multiple methods to the proper PSAPs (Public-Safety Answering Points).
  - ✓ Ensure Next Generation 9-1-1 system provides seamless exchange of information between PSAPs within Washington and adjoining states and regions.
  - ✓ The ability to integrate with first responder networks to allow transmission of data from a reporting person device or application to emergency services with or without triage by a PSAP.
- Ms. Myers is asking that the AC support one other recommendation with the adoption of the plan, that no policy routing changes beyond what is currently in place or under emergent circumstances be implemented until all PSAPs transition to the ESInet II (Emergency Services IP Network) and that we have a process at that time to review those changes.
- Reminder about Policy routing function workshop after AC Meeting.

2) Questions: [00:15:22]

- Vice-Chair Richard Kirton: Will you speak more on that last point during the workshop?
  - ✓ Yes

3) Vice-Chair Richard Kirton asked if the committee is prepared to adopt the NG9-1-1 Plan today?

- Mr. Tim Lenk (Pierce)- Regarding lines 12 and 13, when we look at citizens or their devices, and applications to emergency services without the triage in the PSAP; that is a technology where they can send a video to first responder that is on scene, so that tells us there is a technology that would have to be implemented to emergency services for that mechanism to take place? I like the concept, but would like to better understand what that technology platform would look like, because now that engages our first responders and operations requirements, policy and procedures.
  - ✓ Ms. Myers concurred with Mr. Lenk.
  - ✓ Mr. Adam Wasserman talked about his and Mr. Andy Leneweaver’s visit to Portland to attend the National Governor’s Association workshop on

Emergency Communications. Discussed governance of emergency communication.

- Ms. Melissa Liebert (Wahkiakum)- Just a comment. Section 3.2 regarding GIS (Geographic Information System) MSAG (Multi-Service Access Gateway); there's an additional layer that will be added to that list from six layers to seven in all. I will get you that edit for the document.
  - Ms. Myers- Plan for the NG9-1-1 Plan update
    - ✓ Annually Goals Recommendations will be updated.
    - ✓ Every even year a full plan update.

d. Policy [00:19:49]

Dave Fuller

1) Mr. Fuller briefs the committee on the federal grant application for the National Highway Traffic Safety Grant work group.

- Preliminary work being considered and done on grant:
  - ✓ Eligibility Requirements that were listed under the grant registry as the guide for initial work.
  - ✓ Highlight the work Washington State has already done, give a past/present/future presentation to what it is we would like to fund through the grant.
  - ✓ Already requested that NG9-1-1 subcommittee update the plan, which is now complete.
- Identified nine categories/tenets associated with a good public safety system:
  - ✓ CPE (Customer Premises Equipment) NG9-1-1 equipment upgrades- Already complete
  - ✓ ESInet (Emergency Services IP Network) Transition from ESInet I to ESInet II- In process.
  - ✓ GIS (Geographic Information System) upgrades- Currently being worked on.
  - ✓ Security for the system
  - ✓ Training for the system
  - ✓ Network interoperability as it relates to ESInet, Radios systems, FirstNet.
  - ✓ Support/Refreshment/Upgrade of equipment as we move to the new ESInet System
  - ✓ Features and functions of ESInet II
  - ✓ Going into the future looking into ESInet III
- The work group worked with the State and stakeholders to prioritize five of those nine categories to be grant eligible:
  - ✓ ESInet II transition
  - ✓ GIS work that needs to be completed
  - ✓ ESInet security
  - ✓ Support/Refreshment CPEs currently in place
  - ✓ Network interoperability
- Recommendation from work group to Policy subcommittee was to accept those 5 grant eligible criteria.
- Recommendation to allow subcommittee to assist the State Enhanced 9-1-1 Coordination Office in developing the vetting criteria and participate in the vetting process as it relates to putting the whole package together.
- Created a framework as far as what the grant application will look like, we are still looking for the final rules to be published.

2) Questions:

- Mr. Keith Flewelling (NENA (National Emergency Number Association))- I would like to be clear that there are two applications. One from the counties to the state and one from the State to Federal. Are these all aligned?

- ✓ Mr. Fuller- It is essentially a 2-step process. The federal grant has to be administered through the State or tribal nations. For us it is going to go through the State. There's one application that needs to go up, we don't know what the level of funding is going to be available to the state; But as we put the single application that goes to the federal government, we need a process that lets us say if there is a county specific project that aligns with these five categories.
      - Mr. Flewelling- So you are anticipating getting applications from the counties before the state submits an application to the federal government?
        - ✓ Mr. Fuller- yes.
        - ✓ Mr. Adam Wasserman- Our state application, on behalf of all the counties, that goes out to the feds; we can't just ask for a general number. We have to explain what we are asking for specifically. All the county applications then get rolled up into the state application and sent to the feds.
        - ✓ Mr. Flewelling confirms that the counties should start working on their applications now.

Tim Martindale

- 1) Last met in April in Richland. Discussed ideas for breakout sessions at the Mega forum. The decision has been made to have people apply for the breakout sessions.
- 2) Discussed some ideas for the future of training. Last year we opened up for RFQQ for the first time in a long time. It was a good process. Encourage your training coordinators to get involved, we are still looking for counties to be represented.

  - Mr. Keith Flewelling- Did you say you are reviewing and going to reopen RFQQ?
    - ✓ Mr. Martindale- I believe our contracts with our vendors are good for two years, so we would open it again to see what other vendors are out there.
    - ✓ Mr. Flewelling asks that Advisory Committee be included in the process and given plenty of time to review the documents before they are published, to which Mr. Wasserman agreed.

f. Geographic Information System (GIS) [00:33:29]

Melissa Liebert

- 1) GIS Data model for NENA (National Emergency Number Association) after nine years of development is moving to the final stages. We are expecting it to be approved and published within the next month.
- 2) Discussed an added provisioning boundary as a required layer. Layer is probably going to mirror the PSAP (Public-Safety Answering Point) boundary with a point of contact field. This shouldn't impact the initial stages of transition to NG9-1-1.
- 3) Next subcommittee meeting at the WAURISA conference next Wednesday. We will be looking at the statewide data layer and any discrepancies between counties and how they are inputting data. We are still having some variation issues.

- 4) During the July meeting we will be looking toward next steps.
- 5) Looking at the LVF being turned on Quarter 1 of next year. Hoping the counties will be able to get their site structure address points ready and prepared by the end of Quarter 1, but we understand there may be some carrier issues that may make counties fall behind in that transition.

- 1) Met in person on May 16th.
