# The History of iCOOP

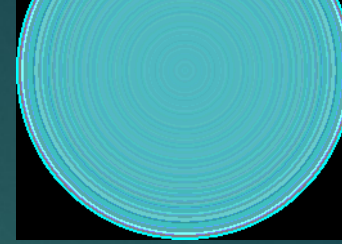
- ▶ Prior to 2012
- ▶ The 2012 snow storm and Governor's Directive 12-20
- ▶ Charter written and approved in February 2013
- ▶ Subsequently added to RCW 38.52
- ▶ Agencies file reports each quarter - Compliance
- ▶ TAG briefed each quarter on agency compliance / metrics and participation

# iCOOP Objectives

3

- ▶ A) Improve the ability of state government to continue to provide essential functions and services under all conditions
- ▶ B) Define, identify, review, and prioritize state government essential functions and services
- ▶ C) Identify, review, and prioritize information technology systems, services, and requirements that support the essential functions identified in (b)
- ▶ D) Build a shared understanding across state agencies of continuity activities, concepts, terms, and requirements. [strategies: education and standardization]
- ▶ E) Enhance the coordination of continuity activities between state agencies
- ▶ F) Map interdependencies between state agency continuity of operations plans and de-conflict incompatible planning assumptions

# iCOOP Going Forward

- ▶ Encourage agencies to define their MEFs (Mission Essential Function)
- ▶ Provide agencies a template to document their interdependencies
- ▶ Submit interdependencies to iCOOP for sharing
- ▶ Develop a state level Mission Essential Function document
- ▶ Work with EMD on how we can status / report state MEFs
