- a. State Enhanced 9-1-1 Coordination Office (SECO) [00:13:40] Adam Wasserman
  - 1) AC 2019 Schedule
    - In Person meetings: April 18th 9AM  
July 18th 9AM  
October 11<sup>th</sup> coinciding with Fall forum in Tri Cities.
    - Phone Conference: Third Thursday of February, May, June, August, September, November and December.
  - 2) Stephanie Haertling is the new Emergency Management Program Specialist 2 (EMPS2) In-training position. Stephanie will still be taking on some of the AAIII functions i.e. SharePoint, AC Meetings, until a replacement is hired.
  - 3) Positions to be filled - postings should be out by the end of January.
    - Administrative Assistant III
    - EMPS 4
    - Budget Manager
  - 4) The Budget has been released from the Governor's Office and it included everything the State Enhance 911 Coordination Office (SECO) requested for the FY19/20 biennium. Budget is now headed to legislature.
  - 5) Discussed Legislation - There are not many bills that affect E911 that have been put forth to legislatures; except SB 5272, (more information in VIII.a.1).
  - 6) Travis bill - More detailed information on costs needed; representative potentially pushing bill forward to be enacted rather than just a report.

- 7) NG911 Grant – Pending the final award to Washington that will indicate how much funding the state of Washington has to work with. Government shutdown is contributing to the timeline. The Advisory Committee Policy Subcommittee Scoring Group completed Independent reviews. There are still two more sessions of review required from the SECO and Advisory Committee Chair and Vice Chair.
- 8) Outage- Working on After Action Report (AAR). Draft will be out closer to completion. Due on March 27<sup>th</sup>. Impact input encouraged. Tuesday’s FCC call was canceled due to shut down.
- 9) Cutover- 50 as of January 17<sup>th</sup>, 2018; 10 remaining.

- 5) Wrapping up definitions. Next will be Revised Code Washington (RCW) changes.

### b. 9-1-1 Communications [00:25:21]

- 1) Phone conference on January 10<sup>th</sup>.
- 2) Discussed Senate Bill (SB) 3238 Federal Communications Commission (FCC) Study for Emergency Alert System (EAS) notification for streaming services like Hulu or Netflix, Public Service Answering Point (PSAP) outage notification, ATT dispatchable locations.

- 5) Richard Kirton asked about 3 new Classifications of Service (COS).
  - WDL2- Wireless call that provides civic-oriented address, sub-address, location – Assumes ALI Data received by PSAP is “dispatchable.”
  - WDL1- Similar but has a lower confidence threshold.
  - WCVC- Wireless call that provides civic-oriented data and traditional X/Y data along with uncertainty data – not expected to be “dispatchable.” Will have more information at the Spring Forum.

- 1) Met on Monday January 14<sup>th</sup>.
- 2) Ring no answer - Setting on ESInet that was activating policy routing rules at 28 seconds, if you didn’t answer call, has been changed to 120 Seconds. Subcommittee intends to learn what setting does, and its impacts.
  - Richard Kirton stated that he would like a better change management process.
- 3) ESInet II Updates- Requested release notes to group for situational awareness.
- 4) Plan to start sharing and tracking issues that are known and might impact a large group of people.
- 5) Policy Routing Function and rules - Greg Pittsford will be working on how to get information about the policy routing rules that are in the ESInet II, to the committee to be vetted and disseminated.

**a. State Fiscal Report [01:52:33]**

Adam Wasserman

- 1) Discussed biennium closeout.
- 2) Referenced handout detailing monthly phone bills paid by the SECO on behalf of counties and costs.

**b. ESInet Report [01:55:20]**

- 1) Andy Leneweaver gave an update on current cutover status and discussed schedule delay to Phase 3 of the transition (ALI cutover) due to various reasons.
- 2) Andy stated that the SECO cannot stop using West until all PSAPs requesting ALI data are cutover. March 15<sup>th</sup> deadline for cutovers.
- 3) March 11-April 2 both ALI databases will be in service.

- 4) Richard asked about time line for SECO to compare Master Street Address Guide (MSAG) to ALI Data and report back to counties. Melissa Liebert clarified that the SECO will not be doing any analysis; the data will be assessed by GeoComm, and a report will be generated and given to the counties.
- 5) Explained that Location Verification Function (LVF) is not the milestone for geospatial routing.
- 6) Request was made for MSAG training manual earlier in the week. Deanna asked about Automatic Number Identifier/Automatic Location Identifier (ANI/ALI) transfers to Oregon. The ALI between Oregon and Washington, as well as Washington to Idaho has been ordered.
- 7) 22 counties as of December 31<sup>st</sup> have eliminated all critical errors. Andy addresses “black holes” in GIS data.
- 8) Referred to the Network Disclosure document.
- 9) Update for Text to 9-1-1 and text initiation.
