Processes and coordinates Line of Duty packages. Creates fitness, mobility, and duty restricting profiles for Airmen as medically necessitated. Assesses and processes accession, transfer, commissioning, and AGR packages. Conducts other nursing/administrative functions as dictated by the unit's Chief Nurse or Chief of Aerospace Medicine.
