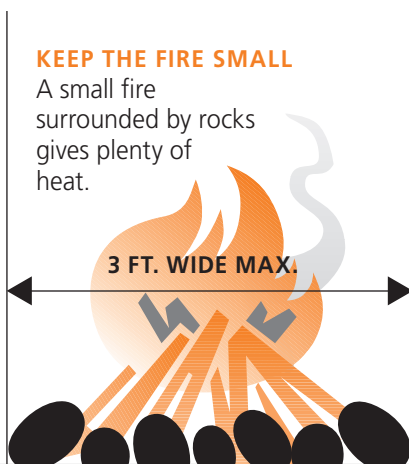
## Be Campfire Safe, Prevent Wildfires



**BURNING OF  
ANY MATERIAL,  
EXCEPT FIREWOOD,  
IS PROHIBITED**

### RECREATIONAL FIRES ARE NOT ALLOWED ON STATE LANDS EXCEPT IN APPROVED DESIGNATED CAMPGROUNDS

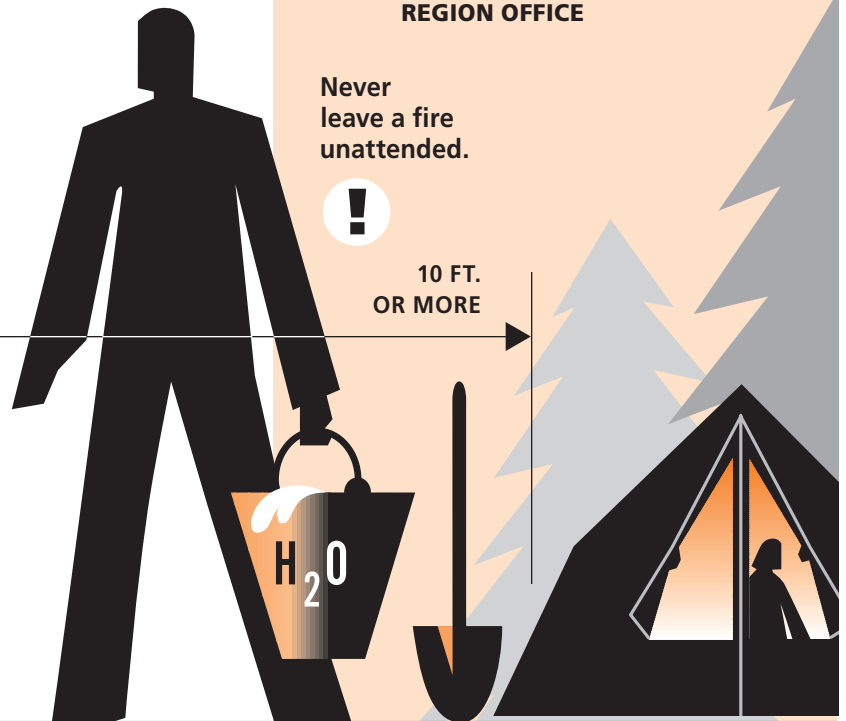
- ▶ Find out fire restrictions where you will camp.
- ▶ Keep a shovel and water close at hand when your campfire is going.
- ▶ Use water to drown the campfire and use a shovel to stir the water and coals to cool it down. Repeat as needed.
- ▶ The fire must be attended at all times by a person capable of extinguishing it quickly.
- ▶ Completely extinguish the fire before you leave.



#### KEEP THE FIRE SMALL

A small fire surrounded by rocks gives plenty of heat.

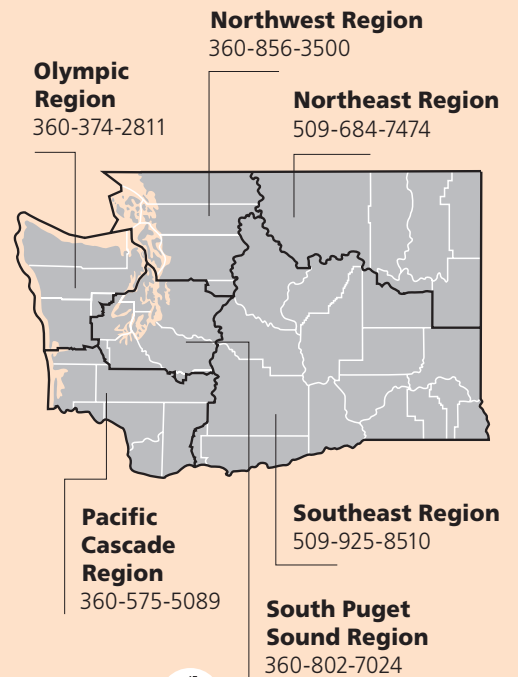
3 FT. WIDE MAX.
