Washington SECC Meeting May 11, 2021

The meeting was held virtually via Zoom. Roll call began at 931 PDT with the meeting starting 8 minutes later, wrapping up at 10:43.

The minutes from the previous meeting were approved. There were no additional agenda items.

The goal is to have the meeting run no more than an hour and a half.

The way monitoring assignments are made has changed. Instead of a specific assignment there is now a list you can choose from. This is in TAB 10-B. This is available on the state EAS <u>website</u>.

The dates have been picked for the next national EAS Test (NPT). The date is August 11 with August 21 as the backup.

The FCC Automatic Reporting System (ARS) will be rolled out soon. Very soon. This will be the communications link between the SECC and the FCC.

The Shake Alert earthquake warning system has rolling out.

Chris Utzinger is retiring. His replacement will be Kevin Wickersham. There will be some overlap.

Brady Aldrich is now the EAS coordinator for Northwest Public Broadcasting. They are one of the EAS distribution systems for Washington.

Terry Spring is retiring, but will continue doing the minutes for the SECC.

Oregon is working on getting funding from their legislature for their analog backup EAS distribution system.

Josh Harsted is the new Chief Engineer at KIRO radio. They are the PEP (Primary Entry Point) for the region. FEMA is investing in the infrastructure at KIRO-AM to insure it will be able to function in an emergency.

The Plan Revision Committee has been busy. They have been working on the new WAPAWS state plan and hope to have it out in a few months. They also composed and submitted comments to the FCC on the recent EAS Notice of Proposed Rulemaking. The document was 5 pages long and commented on 31 paragraphs. They did do any reply comments except on training; that training in EAS is essential for success. They suggested that on-line training can be effective and provided some examples. We are now waiting for the FCC to digest all that. The Plan Revision Committee is always looking for new members and could really use your help. Meeting information is published on the remailer.

The new WAPAWS plan will have a FAQ section. The committee is looking for suggestions for questions. Please put them on the remailer.

The use of WEA (Wireless Emergency Alerts) for COVID vaccine related messages was discussed. This is contrary to the state plan. WEA should only be used for messages for emergencies that require immediate action. These messages have been done in other parts of the country but not in Washington. FEMA is not aware of it happening anywhere in Region 10, either.

The SECC remailer should be used between meetings to resolve problems in a timely fashion. This can also help resolve issues that don't necessarily have to be discussed at the regular SECC meetings.

The Technical Committee reports that a server change at FEMA caused a few problems, especially with Everbridge. Messages with attached audio were not being forwarded. FEMA has transitioned from their data center to the cloud. This caused some of the problems they have been experiencing lately. They are supposed to test the compatibility of the various input systems with IPAWS.

The EAS Tests in Eastern Washington have been going good with few problems.

Ted is still doing his EAS 101 presentation. Contact him to schedule it for your group.

In the Columbia Basin, Walla Walla originated the RMT using Everbridge for the first time. It went fine. WSEM stopped supplying AlertSense to the counties in May.

In the Inland Northwest area, they are working on a new Communications Plan. Their EAS plan will be a component of it.

Simone asked how often TAB 2 should be updated. Probably yearly. But when? It was suggested before fire season. It won't happen this year because we are already having fires.

The WEMD (Washington Emergency Management Department) is still at a level 1 activation. They are still managing 3 missions, COVID-19, Whitman County fire recovery and winter storm recovery. They will be transitioning to a new director the next few months. A new laser projection system is being installed. Tours are welcome after June 30. Please arrange with Tony Clark ahead of time. Shake Alert is rolling out this month. The fire season is starting. As of the end of April there had been 68 fires. Last year there were 6.

AlertSense is becoming obsolete. Eventually we will only need to poll the IPAWS server. It is still in transition.

The meeting ended at 10:43 AM.
