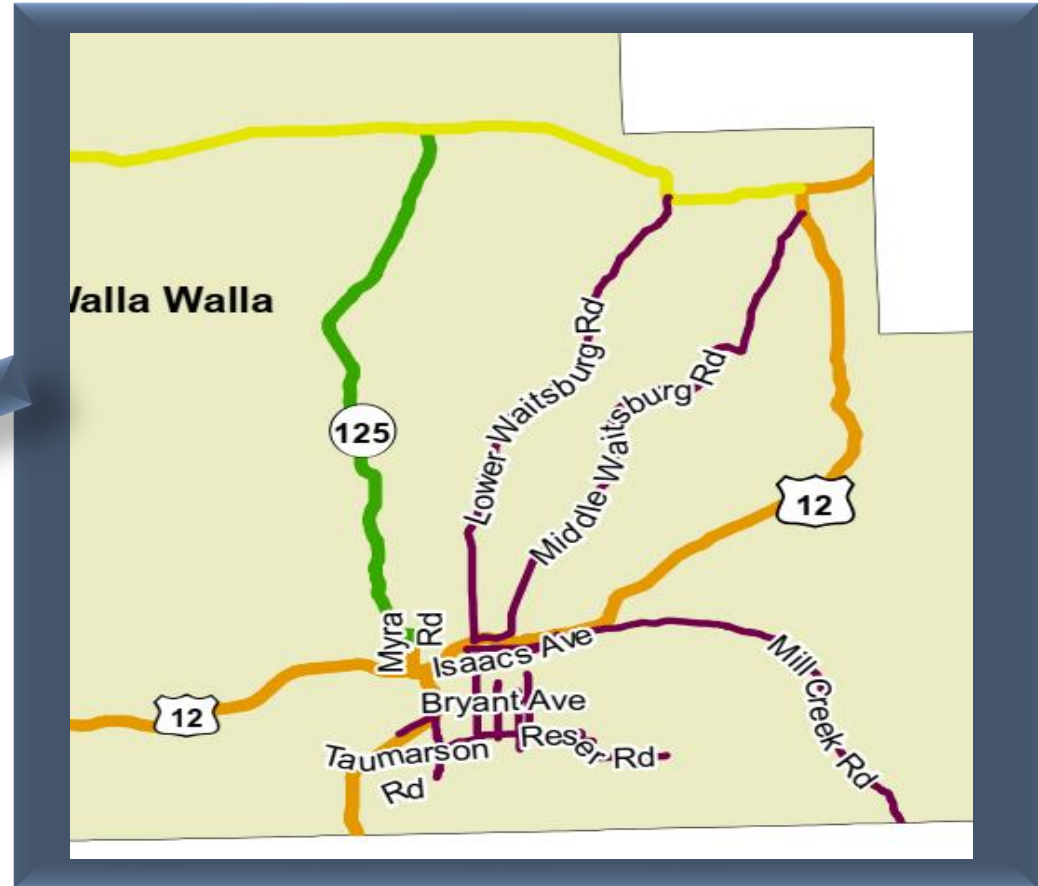
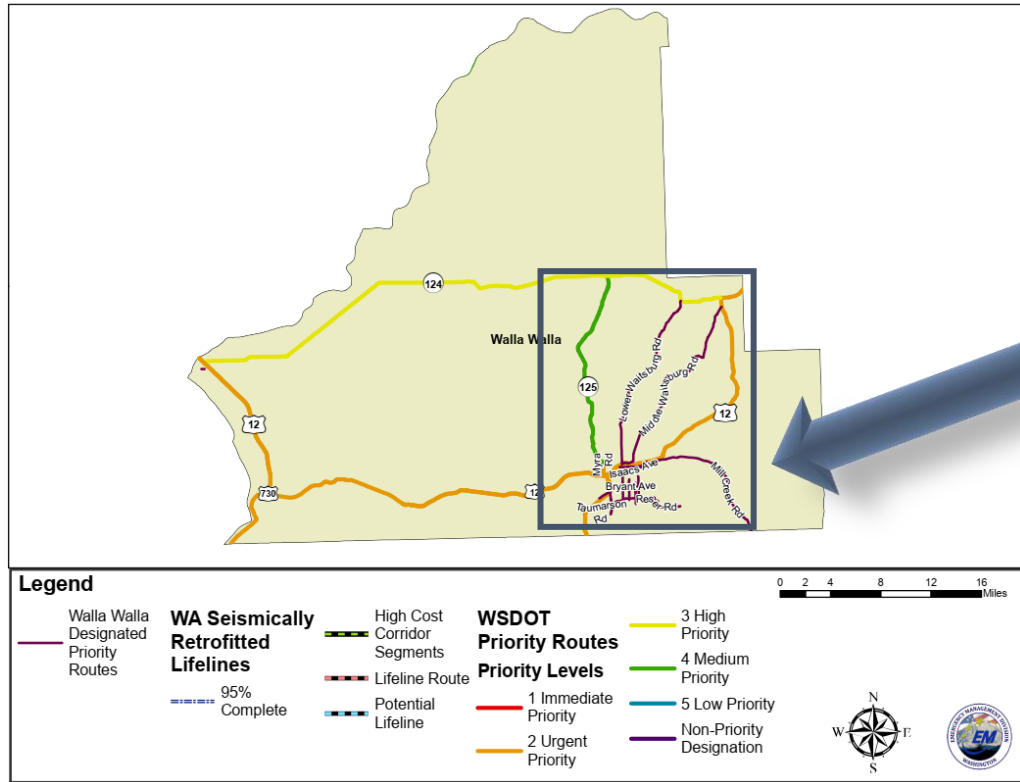

[Water] Infrastructure Systems

Identification of (CONOPS):

- Water infrastructure restoration priorities
- Water-specific resource needs (personnel, equipment, and materials)
- Support to local hospitals (specifically critical access hospitals)
- Water safety issues in each region
- Infrastructure restoration estimates
- Capabilities to provide potable water to those without functioning water systems

Understanding (Situation Overview):

- Each jurisdiction's water infrastructure vulnerabilities (physical hazards)
- Each jurisdiction's needs for water services following a disruption in their water supply
 - Additional area of emphasis on dense urban settings
- Fuel needs for onsite generators (will be primarily addressed in a separate planning effort)



Operational Coordination

Geographic Operations

Describes the structure that will be implemented following a catastrophic incident in which Washington State will need to divide either a part of or all of the state into geographic divisions and branches to vertically integrate operations with the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA).

This framework utilizes the Homeland Security Regions to implement Multi-Agency Coordination Groups.

Note: This is a planning framework. This framework will be incorporated into the CIA itself once complete.

Purpose
This document is a supporting attachment of the Catastrophic Incident Annex (CIA) and operates in conjunction with all its appendices. This attachment is meant to describe the structure that will be implemented following a catastrophic incident in which Washington State will need to divide either a part of or all of the state into geographic divisions and branches to vertically integrate operations with the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA). This structure should maintain alignment with FEMA Region Ten (X), the Washington National Guard (WNG), and the Washington State Emergency Management Division (EMD) and will ensure the proper execution of the Planning, Operational Coordination, and Situational Assessment Core Capabilities.

Primary Response Core Capability	
Planning	Conduct a systematic process engaging the whole community as appropriate in the development of executable strategic, operational, and/or tactical-level approaches to meet defined objectives.
Operational Coordination	Establish and maintain a unified and coordinated operational structure and process that appropriately integrates all critical stakeholders and supports the execution of Core Capabilities.
Situational Assessment	Provide all decision makers with decision-relevant information regarding the nature and extent of the hazard, any cascading effects, and the status of the response.

Situation Overview
Catastrophic incidents that occur over a large geographic area, affect multiple counties, and involve response operations by the federal government, will likely require the establishment of
