<b>MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS FOR CONSIDERATION:</b>			
<p>1. Successful completion of a BS / BA or MS / MA in Meteorology or Atmospheric Sciences from an approved / accredited college / university or completion of 24 semester hours of college-level courses in prerequisite mathematics and meteorology, including 6 semester hours of dynamic meteorology, 6 semester hours of analysis and prediction of weather systems (synoptic/mesoscale) in combination with a BS / BA degree from an accredited college / university.</p> <p>*Exception: Applicants with previously granted waivers to aforementioned degree requirements will be considered if he / she has demonstrated superb understanding and application of meteorology with extensive operational experience.</p> <p>2. Willingness to operate with habitually-aligned Army units and other Joint / Allied customers is <i>mandatory</i>.</p> <p>3. Ability to participate in worldwide mobility tasking is <i>mandatory</i>.</p> <p>4. Successful completion of USAF Weather Officer Course or equivalent training is <i>mandatory</i>.</p> <p>5. Undergraduate or graduate degree / academic specialization in Meteorology or Atmospheric Science is <i>preferred</i>.</p> <p>6. Must meet the Air Force physical fitness standards.</p> <p>7. Must possess a TOP SECRET security clearance.</p>			
<b>SPECIALIZED EXPERIENCE:</b>			
<p>* This is not a commissioning opportunity. Current and former officers may apply.</p> <p>1. Must possess strong executive leadership qualities with character of the highest integrity.</p> <p>2. Must have an in-depth knowledge and experience in managing weather operations, training, and resources.</p> <p>3. Must demonstrate excellent interpersonal and communication skills, both orally and in writing, at all levels</p> <p>4. Experience in providing operational weather support to Army customer(s) (ground and/or air) is <i>preferred</i>.</p> <p>5. Experience leading within the ANG Weather community is <i>preferred</i>.</p>			
<b>OTHER REQUIREMENTS:</b>			
<p>1. Selectee is expected to have completed ANG Weather Applications Course (131 TRF / WRTC) or equivalent training prior to application. Those who have not completed training may still be considered with the expectation that selectee attends ANG Weather Applications Course within 12 months, or earliest class-up date, of hire.</p> <p>2. If not already completed, selectee is expected to attend Army Weather Support Course (AWSC) and Escape, Conduct After Capture Course (ECAC) at earliest availability.</p>			
<b>AREA OF CONSIDERATION:</b>			
Current members of the Washington Air National Guard and those eligible to join.			
<b>WORKING CONDITIONS:</b>			
Work will be conducted both inside and outside, and possibly in inclement weather. Training / deployment work environment may include field conditions with limited resources.			
<b>SUMMARY OF DUTIES:</b>			
<p>Commands a Weather Flight of 17 personnel; consisting mostly of traditional members. Provides meteorological services to the Washington National Guard, including the Adjutant General, State Homeland Response Force (HRF), the 194th Wing, two Army National Guard Brigade Combat Teams, and two Army National Guard Combat Aviation Brigades, and one Army National Guard Military Intelligence Brigade. Responsible for training, equipping, and managing weather personnel. Manages and plans unit finances. Oversees the analyzation and evaluation of meteorological data and prepares forecast products. Briefs battle staff personnel on current and forecast weather. Instructs personnel on application of weather to operations and interpretation and use of meteorological products. Maintains personnel and unit readiness for deployment.</p>
