
Terms used in this report:

Incident Type	Definition
FireTotal number	Total number of fire related incidents
Fire-Other	These are incidents reported to Department of Natural Resources per a contract agreement, but have nothing to do with an actual fire, for example individuals locked behind a DNR gate after hours would get referred to us for calling a DNR representative
Wildfire	These are calls on the DNR fire line of reports of wildfires. Many of these calls (though not all) are made by dispatch centers looking for assistance from DNR
Fixed Nuclear FacilityTotal Number	This is the total number of incidents occurring at the nuclear facilities within the state
DOE-RL	Department of Energy Hanford Site
CGS-RL	Energy Northwest
Areva	Company that produces nuclear fuel for the Columbia Generating Station. Areva changed its name back to Framatome effective February 2018.
NAVY	These are Naval facilities mostly located at Bangor Bremerton
HAZMATTotal Number	Total number of spill calls received on behalf of department of Ecology
Hazmat-Other	All spill calls received for the department of Ecology except those involving railroads
Railroad-Hazmat	All Dept of Ecology spill calls involving rail lines and trains. Generally involving BNSF and UPRR
Other-total number	This is a catch all type that encompasses many different categories of incidents
CISM	Critical incident stress management—these are volunteers dispatched to assist local jurisdictions in their help of citizens involved in tragedy such as suicide, auto accidents, CPR in progress etc.
Earthquake	Any earthquakes meeting the threshold of 2.8 M + occurring in the state.
Other incidents not categorized	All incidents that do not have a category. This includes events such as warming shelter openings, use of volunteers for communications during demonstrations and local EOC activations not related to an already issued state incident number.

RailroadOther	These are non hazmat related incidents that occur in or near rail yards or trains such as trespasser on tracks or train derailments.
	NOTE: these events are confirmed to have no hazmat spill involved in them. Any rail road issues that involve hazmat will be
	categorized under Railroad—Hazmat.
Suspicious Act-Sec Breach	Suspicious Activity/Security Breach—reports received from the National Response Center documenting various suspicious
	activities at key infrastructure facilities
Tsunami Info Statement	All information statements issued by the National Tsunami Warning Center, most often after an earthquake in the Pacific Rim
Amber Alerts	Any Amber Alerts issued
Assistance Request	These are requests for state assistance or resources not related to an already existing incident number
DOH Secures	DOH Secures message
Tsunami	Any Tsunami watch, Warning or Advisory that is issued for any part of WA Coast.
Urban Fire	Fire that takes place within an Urban Area that is beyond the capability of the local jurisdiction to manage
Equipment Outages	Any outages in equipment in the AWC expected or unexpected that last for a significant amount of time or that require a
	significant amount of resources to manage.
WNG 10th CST	Deployments of the WNG 10 th Civil Support Team (CST) when notified by the JOC
SARtotal Number	Total number of Search and Rescue missions conducted within the state
Beacon	ELT/EPIRB activations. ELT's are the Emergency Locator Transmitter on Aircraft and EPIRB are the marine vessel equivalent
PLB/SPOT	Personal locator beacons that hikers and other individuals wear when out in remote areas that can be activated when needing
	help in areas without cell coverage or telephones
AVN SAR	Search and Rescue involving overdue aircraft or crashed aircraft
National Park	Search and Rescue taking place on National Park Land, these are generated at the request of the National Park Service and
	generally take place either at Mt Rainier National Park or Olympic National Park
SAR-Other	All other Search and Rescue activities that do not fall within one of the categories above.
Tsunami Debris	This category was created in the aftermath of the 2011 Japan earthquake/tsunami. This category was only relevant during the
	years 2013 and 2014 and has been phased out as of the end of 2016
Terrorism	Any events requiring a state response in the aftermath of a terrorist event
Phone	Any phone line outages affecting 911 dispatch centers
Weather	Weather events throughout the state. The documented weather events are watches and warnings. Only the first event is
	counted. All subsequent events issued are counted under the first incident number until all have expired.

Multi / All	These incidents have already been attributed to the individual County and are captured here as well to illustrate cross county
	operations, take place solely in Oregon, or is an incident that can be attributed to the entire state such as COVID.


Historical Data % Growth

Note: Some of this change in the number of incidents is a result of how data is collected and reported within the AWC.




Incidents by Year


Total Number of Incidents





Total Hazmats by Year





Total SAR missions by Year




















