#### WORKING CONDITIONS:

- 1. Work may occasionally require travel away from the normal duty station on military or commercial aircraft.

- 4. Guide and train personnel in inspection and exercise requirements and assign technical projects/tasks to team members.
- 5. Develop, integrate, and direct the wing/center inspection planning activities.
- 6. Manage complex programs/projects, plans, and identify difficult issues requiring modification to existing policies or process.
- 7. Perform analysis for potential mission impact and develop alternatives and/or resolutions to deficiencies.
- 8. Analyze problems discovered in inspections/exercises or actual operations and make recommendations for improvement.
- 9. Mange the integration of multi-disciplinary resources necessary to support wing/center tasks and projects.
- 10. Identify future resource needs to include facilities, equipment, and personnel, and implement strategies to support future inspections/exercise plans and projects.
- 11. Perform thorough analysis of unit capabilities versus inspection requirements to determine the most efficient exercise and inspection scenarios which minimize costs and maximize unit readiness.
- 12. Formulate and execute inspection/exercise scenarios relevant to the primary mission of the wing/center and the surrounding environment.
- 13. Evaluate unit objectives during exercise planning, develop inspection criteria, analyze data, report trend information, and brief results.
- 14. Create, plan, schedule, and execute exercises/inspections to measure unit compliance and capability to execute the mission.
- 15. Identify deficiencies and help the organization implement corrective action plans and/or countermeasures to minimize known risks.
- 16. Perform follow-up to determine effectiveness progress.
- 17. Compile and analyze unit reporting data to ensure compliance with federally mandated programs.
- 18. Establish, develop, and maintain effective working relationships with various agencies and organizations at all levels on matters that concerns inspections.
- 19. Advise superiors on inspection policy matters, with special emphasis on intelligence oversight, emerging technology inspection criteria, and the nuclear enterprise.
- 20. Meet with key customers and coordinating officials to assess customer satisfaction, explain organization policy and procedures, and special assignment.
