Introduction	A brief introduction of the Office of Independent Investigations (OII) was provided; with a more in-depth presentation to be provided on February 27 th .	
	OII is authorized to investigate all use of deadly force by law enforcement across the state, essentially a new limited law enforcement organization that will be working with you at some point to begin gathering information.	
	OII will be taking over scene investigations of any new cases and conducting criminal investigations of those cases.	
	State statute authorizes the involved agency and the Invest other investigating agencies to share whatever information about the incident that they have from the scene; will also be working with 911 operators and dispatchers to get needed information in any criminal investigation, and will be reaching out to look into creating some Mobius with many of your organizations.
