Decisions/Recommendations:

The following recommendations were drafted by the committee for inclusion in the annual State of Cybersecurity Report to the legislature. This report is drafted by WaTech, and this advisory committee is required by law to contribute to it.

- Recommendation 1: Define a methodology for characterizing cybersecurity risk and vulnerability to guide committee recommendations and inform a statewide critical infrastructure cybersecurity strategy.
- Recommendation 2: Explore an approach that identifies state agencies as sector-specific leads to facilitate cybersecurity advice and recommendations for each of the 16 critical infrastructure sectors.
- Recommendation 3: Document all federal and state laws that pertain to cybersecurity for critical infrastructure owners/operators and cross-examine them for consistency and policy gaps.
- Recommendation 4: Prioritize cybersecurity technical assistance and resources to critical infrastructure with the greatest risk and least capacity to manage risk.

Next Steps:

- Schedule six committee meetings for 2024. Meetings will be held every other month starting in January.
- Review final State of Cybersecurity report and see it published to the legislature.

Date: November 1, 2023

Discussion Topics:

- Training updates provided by Susan Forsythe, EMD and Scott Lancaster, WSP covered future SERC sponsored workshops (Energy and Lithium-Ion Battery Symposium 2/22/24-2/24/24, Eastside HazMat Workshop 5/3/24-5/5/24), DOT rail trainings offered in 5 counties, trainings on EMD website for LEPCs, and NWAC brief out.
- EPCRA update provided by Diane Fowler, ECY outlined recent projects with SEOC, introduced new assistant Michaela Morris, and advised new methods of tracking Tier Two's on Tribal lands.
- SERC budget voted to use allocated money for virtual classes that will be offered to all LEPCs.
- HMEP updated by Sierra Wardell, EMD reminded that Christopher Burd is the POC for grant, discussed beginning of year two of grant, and will work with PHMSA on reallocated funds.
- LEPC planning update by Susan Forsythe, EMD discussed LEPC 101 and 102 trainings, the potential combination of two groups of LEPCs, and noted submitted plans.

- Tribes and Nations update provided by Susan Forsythe, EMD on behalf of Erik Riske, EMD gave information on Tribal Forum in late November 2023.
- HazMat Capabilities Assessment was discussed by Chief Patrick Reid, Chair on redoing the CBRN assessment and venturing into HazMat specific looks into regional teams. Looking to address gaps in HazMat capabilities throughout the state and the effectiveness of regional teams.
- Presentation provided by Paradigm to outline free trainings they have to offer through PHMSA regulations.
- Chief Patrick Reid was re-elected to his second term as Chair of the SERC.
- LEPC Records Retention Workgroup update provided by Danielle Plenge, EMD, group is going to
 present the short schedule created specifically to address Tier Two reports for LEPCs at February
 2024 meeting.
