Drug Labs per Year 2015 to 2023



- CEMPs must include: <u>expeditious notification of citizens who can</u> <u>reasonably be determined to be at risk during a hazardous material spill</u> <u>or release</u>
- For Type 1 or 2 incidents: Ecology must provide for one public meeting.
 - Provide for remote participation
 - May be held jointly with county's regular meeting
 - Must include
 - Ecology
 - Local organization or emergency management
 - Responsible Party




