#### **Essential Considerations of National Guard activation**

National Guard is a RESOURCE amongst the many others considered by WA Emergency Management Division

All RESOURCES requests are vetted and assigned at the Washington State Emergency Operations Center

Supported agencies may be responsible for ALL COSTS of the National Guard's response

Ensure coordination is with a service member that has the appropriate authority to commit resources

- Commands all Washington Army and Air National Guard forces and is
- Director of the State's Emergency Management and Enhanced 911 programs
- ✓ Homeland Security Advisor to the Governor of Washington
- ✓ State Administrative Agent for all DoH Security grants







#### WASHINGTON NATIONAL GUARD

- More than **8,000 Citizen-Soldiers Airmen Guards**
- The WA **Army** National Guard = five Major Subordinate Commands
- The WA **Air** National Guard = two Wings and the Western Air Defense Sector
- The WA **State Guard** = all-volunteer, uniformed public service organization

## National Guard Introduction— State & Federal Missions













State

State Active Duty (SAD)
State Status / State Controlled
State pays<sup>\$</sup>, Governor controls
Example: State emergency &
disaster response (floods, fires)



Title 32 State Duty
Federal Status / State Controlled
Fed pays<sup>\$</sup>, Governor controls
Examples: Hurricane Katrina &
COVID-19 Response





Title 10 Federal Duty
Federal Status / Federal Controlled
Fed Pays<sup>\$</sup> & President (Fed) controls
Example: Iraq & Afghanistan

<sup>\$</sup> Supported Agency (Fed, State, local, tribe) may be required to reimburse all or some costs, regardless of response status



#### The Choice to Cross the "Military Support Threshold"

Submit an ICS FORM 213 –


Resource Request (or via WebEOC)
to the State Emergency Management
Division through your county or tribal
EOC

Don't ask for the 'thing'

Ask for what you need done

"I need flood fighting capabilities!"

"I need the National Guard to fill sandbags"







#### Conditions/ Situations Driving the effort with EMD to develop a partnered program



- Efforts Not Synced, internal or external
- Not employing appropriate planning methods (civil vs. military)
- Myths and Misunderstandings



- Local needs exceeded EMD capacity
- Reorganizing, Duty Realignments, and Prioritizing
- EMD is the lead State agency for all things EM



- Desire to understand military resourcing process
- Correct points of contact
- Limited planning resources

Unfortunate results = low follow up, low follow through, questionable legalities, little value delivered to local customers










#### **Commodity Points of Distribution (CPOD) Planning Project**








#### Type III IMT TTX & 10th HRF DRE

#### **Lessons Learned Highlights**







Sustain: Multi-agency partnership

- Adds complexity and realism
- Know each other before a disaster

Sustain: Flexibility created through diverse/ crossagency shared planning

Sustain: Know the correct National Guard pointsof-contact "Trusted agents"

Improve: Syncing long-range planning between multi agencies

Improve: Communications gaps between responding agencies
