## Camp Murray Installation Access | REAL ID Act of 2005

Camp Murray is following the REAL ID Act of 2005. This means:

- All personnel who require access to Camp Murray must produce a Department of Defense (DoD) or other authorized credential including one of the following:
  - DoD Common Access Card (CAC)
  - o Defense Biometric Identification System (DBIDS) Card
  - Next Generation Uniformed Services ID Card
  - Washington State Enhanced Driver's License or Identification Card [only if already registered into DBIDS by the Camp Murray Visitor Control Center (VCC)]
  - Veteran Health Identification Card (VHIC) [only if already registered into DBIDS by the Camp Murray VCC]
- If visitors who are require access to Camp Murray DO NOT have an abovementioned credential, they must be vetted for a Visitor Pass [AF Form 75].
  - For visitors to qualify for a Visitor Pass, they must produce one of the following:
    - A Driver's License or Identification Card that is compliant with the REAL ID Act 2005 [Enhanced Driver's License or Identification Card]
    - US Passport or Passport Card
    - Federally issued Personal Identity Verification (PIV)-1 Card
    - Permanent Resident Card/Alien Registration Receipt Card [Form I-551]
    - A full list of acceptable credentials, by State, is available at https://www.dhs.gov/real-id
  - If a visitor **DOES NOT** have a REAL ID Act of 2005 compliant credential, as listed in the preceding paragraphs, they will need to produce a combination of source identity documents listed below:
    - Transportation Woker Identification Credential (TWIC) + noncompliant Driver's License or Identification Card
    - VHIC + non-compliant Driver's License or Identification Card
    - Original or certified true copy of a Birth Certificate bearing a raised seal + Social Security Card + non-compliant Driver's License or Identification Card
- Personnel not meeting the identification or fitness standards for installation access
  MUST be escorted or they will be denied entry.
