## SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

- 18-2776
- On August 1, the Red Flag Warnings continued for portions of Kittitas (Kittitas Valley), Klickitat, and Yakima Counties (east slopes of the south Cascades) through August 1. The Warning was extended to be in effect until 2300 on August 2.
  - On August 1, the Fire Weather Watch continued for portions of Lincoln, Adams, Grant, Chelan, Douglas, Whitman, and Spokane Counties for August 2nd.
  - On August 1, the Red Flag Warning continued for portions of Lincoln, Douglas, Grant, Adams, and Okanogan Counties for August 1st.
  - On August 1, the Red Flag Warning continued for Benton, Franklin, Walla Walla, Columbia, Yakima, Kittitas, and Klickitat Counties for August 1st-2nd.
  - On August 1, all Fire Weather Watches were upgraded to Red Flag Warnings due to gusty winds and low humidity. This affected the following counties: Kittitas, Yakima, Chelan, Douglas, Okanogan, Adams, Grant, Lincoln, Ferry, Stevens, Pend Oreille, Spokane and Whitman.
  - On August 2, the final Red Flag Warning expired at 2300 hrs, closing this event.
- 18-2785
- On August 1, the Chelan Hills Fire Mobilization continued for Douglas County's Fire District Four. The request was approved on July 27 at 1515 hrs. The State EOC activated to Level 2, Partial Activation, at that time.
  - The Chelan Hills Fire demobilized on August 1 at 2359 hrs. The State EOC remained at Level 2 for the ongoing Milepost 90 Fire.
- 18-2844
- On August 1, the Milepost 90 Fire Mobilization continued for Klickitat County's Fire District 11. The request was approved on July 31 at 2145 hrs. The State EOC maintained Level 2, Partial Activation at the time.
  - On August 3, the fire was demobilized at 0800 hours. The State EOC remained at Level 2 for the ongoing Angel Springs Fire.
- 18-2824
- On August 1, Whatcom County opened a rescue for an injured female hiker with a broken ankle 1½ miles west of Devil's Pass. The State Emergency Operations Officers (SEOOs) coordinated the use of a helicopter from King County to rescue the hiker and fly her to the hospital.
- 18-2858
- On August 2, Snohomish County opened a search for a missing hiker outside of Granite Falls. The SEOOs coordinated requests for mountain rescue and ground searcher assets with the City of Seattle, as well as Pierce, Kitsap, King and Skagit Counties. The SEOOs also contacted the Air Force Rescue Coordination Center (AFRCC) to coordinate the use of cell phone forensics.
  - On August 3, Snohomish County requested mountain rescue, search dogs, and ground searchers as possible for the 28-year-old female east of Granite Falls for August 4 starting at 0600 hours. Coordination was made with

Seattle, Pierce, Kitsap, Skagit, Thurston, and Lewis counties for resources. Additional coordination's were made for the continuing search on August 4.

- On August 4, Snohomish County requested trailing dogs to assist on August 5. Coordination was made with King, Whatcom, Pierce, Island, Kitsap, Grays Harbor, Lewis and Clark Counties
- On August 5, Snohomish County requested Helo with Forward Looking Infrared Radar (FLIR). Coordination was made with King County and AFRCC. King County and AFRCC declined this mission.
- On August 6, Snohomish County requested USCG helicopter with FLIR respond. AFRCC was contacted to authorize its use.
- On August 6, Snohomish County requested 10 x tracking dogs, 35 x mountain rescue, 25 x ground searchers, 1 x utility helicopter, 1 x border patrol aircraft, 1 x sleeper bus, the "King CO Soup Ladies," and the State SAR Planning Unit. SEOO contacted all WA State counties via NAWAS and AFRCC. AFRCC provided 1 x Airplane with FLIR and 1 x Helo with FLIR. AFRCC coordinated the use of 1 x helicopter for the morning of August 7.
- On August 14 Snohomish County requested 14 x air-scent dog teams to work on August 17 and August 18. The SEOOs coordinated the use of these dog teams with Clark, King, Kitsap, and Kittitas Counties.
- The search remained open at of the time of this reports submission.

18-2880 • On August 3, A State Fire Mobilization request was received for the 800-acre Angel Springs Fire east of Davenport in Lincoln County. Chief Batiste approved the request at 0745 hours. The State EOC was already elevated to Level 2 for the Milepost 90 Fire.

• State mobilization for this fire ended at 2359 hrs. on August 10. The State EOC remained at Level 2 due to the ongoing Cougar Creek Fire.

18-2894 On August 3, Whatcom County conducted a rescue of an injured female at Baker Lake. The SEOOs coordinated the use of a helicopter from Whidbey Naval Air Station (NAS) and Mountain Rescue personnel from Skagit County to assist. The subject was flown to the hospital for treatment.

18-2896 On August 4, the National Weather Service issued a Red Flag Warning for Chelan and Okanogan Counties. The Warning expired as scheduled, closing this event.

18-2903 On August 4, Chelan County responded to an activation of a Personal Locator Beacon (PLB) with coordinates between Red Mountain and Buck Mountain. They were able to locate 3 climbers, 1 of which appeared to be severely injured, but were unable to land their helicopter. A helicopter with hoist was requested and coordination accomplished with Snohomish and King County. After King County's aircraft turned back due to weather, coordination was accomplished with the AFRCC for an aircraft from Whidbey NAS. The subject was located deceased.

18-2910 On August 5, Yakima County opened a rescue of a female hiker with head injuries in the Dewey Lake area. A helicopter with hoist was requested and due to the life safety issues, it was determined that AFRCC would provide the quickest response with a federal helicopter. A medical team hiked to the subject in advance of the helicopter and determined her injuries were more superficial

than previously reported. Subject refused further assistance and the helicopter was cancelled before liftoff.

18-2914

- On August 5, the National Weather Service (NWS) issued an Excessive Heat Watch for the following counties: Benton, Columbia, Franklin, Kittitas, Klickitat, Walla Walla, and Yakima, due to forecasted temperatures ranging between 98-109 degrees.
- On August 5, the National Weather Service (NWS) issued another Excessive Heat Watch for the following counties: Adams, Asotin, Chelan, Douglas, Garfield, Grant, Lincoln, Okanogan, Pend Oreille, Stevens, Spokane, and Whitman Counties.
- On August 6, the NWS issued an Excessive Heat Warning for Clark, Skamania and Klickitat Counties.
- On August 6, the NWS issued a Red Flag Warning for the North & Central Cascades.
- On August 7, the NWS upgraded the Excessive Heat Watch to an Excessive Heat Warning which affected Central Washington Counties through August 9.
- On August 7, the NWS issued a Fire Weather Watch for South Eastern Washington from Thursday Morning to Friday Evening and the remainder of Central & Eastern Washington from Thursday Morning to Saturday Evening.
- On August 8, the National Weather Service issued a Red Flag warning for the afternoons and evenings of August 9 and August 10 for the following counties: Chelan, Okanogan, Douglas, Ferry, Lincoln, Pend Oreille, Spokane, Stevens, Kittitas, Yakima, Adams, Grant and Whitman Counties.
- On August 9, the National Weather Service issued another Red Flag Warning the afternoon and evening of August 10 for the following counties: Walla Walla, Columbia, Asotin, Benton, Yakima, Klickitat and Kittitas Counties. This superseded the previously issued Fire Weather Watch.
- On August 9, the National Weather Service extended the Red Flag Warning for Okanogan, Chelan, Ferry, Douglas, Grant, Lincoln and Ferry County until the morning of August 11.
- On August 10, the National Weather Service extended the Red Flag Warning until the evening of August 11 for Okanogan, Chelan, Douglas, Grant, Ferry, Lincoln, Adams, Stevens, Pend Oreille, Spokane and Whitman Counties.
- On August 10, Pendleton Weather Service extended the Red Flag Warning for the Lower Columbia Basin of Washington and the Eastern Washington Southern Columbia Basin until the morning of 11 August, due to the possibility of gusty winds and low humidity for Kittitas, Yakima, Klickitat, Benton, Franklin, Walla Walla, Columbia and Asotin counties. The warning expired as scheduled and this weather incident was closed on August 11.

- 18-2929
- On August 6, Spokane County FD #3 requested a Fire Mobilization for the Silver Lake Fire outside of Cheney. The request was approved at 1715 on that date. The State EOC maintained Level 2, Partial Activation.
  - Mobilization ended at 2359 hrs. on August 10. The state EOC remained at Level 2 due to ongoing Cougar Creek Fire.
- 18-2932
- On August 6, Kitsap County conducted a search for a missing 72-year-old male in Port Orchard. Two GSD, air scent and trailing dogs were requested. Coordination with Pierce and Mason Counties was conducted. The subject was found and taken to the hospital.
- 18-2935
- On August 7, Skamania County conducted a search for a missing 80-year-old male on the Pacific Crest Trail. Coordination was made with Lewis, Cowlitz, Clark and Klickitat counties for a Hasty Search Team. Subject was found with no medical injuries.
- 18-2960
- On August 8, Skamania County requested a helicopter with hoist to extract a 52-year-old male with a broken back. Coordination was accomplished with the AFRCC for a US Coast Guard helicopter out of Astoria and the subject was extracted and transported to a hospital in Portland for further care.
- 18-2974
- On August 9, Skagit County requested a helicopter to assist with the search for a 51-year-old female hiker on Sno/King Mountain. Snohomish and King were not able to provide any support, however a helicopter from US Customs was mobilized via local coordination. The subject was later located in good condition by ground Search and Rescue staff.
- 18-2975
- On August 9, DOE Hanford declared an Abnormal Event for an electrical fire at the lab located at 222 South. Hanford DOE dispatched Hanford Fire Department and the fire was put out with an extinguisher, after which the incident was terminated.
- 18-2985
- On August 9, Mason County Sheriff's Office initiated a search for a female in her 60s, with medical issues, who hiked up a trail from the Browns Creek Campground; along with a male in his 60s, who went up the trail looking for the initial subject. The SEOOs coordinated the use of additional ground searchers with Kitsap, Thurston and Grays Harbor Counties. The additional searchers were later cancelled before deployment when the subjects were located and hiked out on their own.
- 18-2993
- On August 10, a State Fire Resources Mobilization Request was received for the Cougar Creek Fire located in Chelan County. Chief John Batiste from the WSP approved the State Mobilization at 1815 hours. The State EOC was already at Level 2 due to other ongoing mobilizations.
  - State fire resources demobilized at 2359 hrs. on August 15. The State EOC remained at Level 2 due to the ongoing Boyd's Fire.
- 18-3004
- On August 11, Chelan County requested a helicopter with hoist to extract a climber with a crushed leg on Mount Stewart. The SEOOs coordinated the use of a helicopter with hoist from the Whidbey Island Naval Air Station (NAS) through the AFRCC. The subject was transported to an ambulance via helicopter, then to the hospital for treatment.

- On August 11, a State Fire Resources Mobilization Request was received for the Grass Valley Fire in Douglas County. Fire Mobilization for the Grass Valley Fire was approved by Chief John Batiste at 1345 hours. The State EOC was already at Level 2 due to other ongoing mobilizations.
  - Fire mobilization ended at 1200 hrs. on August 15. The State EOC remained at Level 2 due to the ongoing Cougar Creek Fire.

- On August 11, a State Fire Resources Mobilization Request was received for the Bofer Canyon Fire in Benton County. Fire Mobilization was approved by Chief John Batiste of WSP at 1545 hours. The State EOC was already at Level 2 due to other ongoing mobilizations.

- On August 11, a State Fire Resources Mobilization request was received from Stevens County for the Boyds Fire. Fire Mobilization was approved by Chief Batiste as of 2015 hours. The State EOC was already at Level 2 due to other ongoing mobilizations.
- Fire mobilization ended at 2359 hrs. on August 21. The State EOC remained at Level 2 due to the ongoing National Guard deployments.
- 18-3025
- On August 11, Pend Oreille County initiated a search for a missing 83-year old female in the Cusick area. Search dogs and a helicopter overflight were requested from Spokane County Sheriff's Office. The subject was located in good condition the next day.
- 18-3018
- On August 11, Cowlitz County initiated a search for a missing male hiker in the Blue Lake Trail area. Trailing dogs, ground searchers and an aircraft with FLIR were requested. Coordination included (counties).
  - On August 12, Cowlitz requested an additional 15-20 GSAR, 1-2 Air Scent Dogs and 1 x Portable Cell Tower. The SEOOs conducted the coordination of these assets with the following counties: Wahkiakum, Thurston, Kitsap, Mason and Grays Harbor.
  - On August 12, Cowlitz requested an additional 20-30 GSAR, 1-2 Nationally Certified Water Human Remains dog and 1 x Portable Cell Tower for 13 August. The SEOOs conducted the coordination with following counties: Clark, Lewis, Pierce, Skamania, Wahkiakum, Thurston, Kitsap, Mason and Grays Harbor..
  - On Aug 13, Cowlitz County requested 40-50 GSAR, two dog teams to search human remains, and a helicopter to do conduct searches. SEOOs conducted coordination of the GSAR assets with the following counties: Clark, King, Lewis, Skamania, Kitsap, Pierce, Klickitat, and Yakima.
  - On August 14, Cowlitz County requested a helicopter with FLIR. King and Snohomish Counties were contacted.
  - On Aug 14, Cowlitz County requested 40 GSAR, and dog teams. SEOOs conducted coordination for these assets with the following counties, and agencies: Clark, Lewis, Skamania, Kitsap, Pierce, Klickitat, Kittitas, Wahkiakum, Thurston, Olympic Mountain Rescue (OMR), and Yakima were contacted.

- On August 15, the subject was located in serious condition on the south flank of Mt St Helens. Cowlitz County requested a helicopter with hoist. SEOOs contacted King County and requested their support. The airlift was later cancelled. The subject was packed out and flown to the hospital via LifeFlight.
- 18-3046
- On August 12, the National Weather Service issued a Fire Weather Watch from early August 13 through early August 14 for Clark, Cowlitz and Skamania Counties.
- 18-3057
- On August 13, The Fire Weather Watch was cancelled without incident. On August 13, the International Emergency Rescue Coordination Center (IERCC) reported an injured 30-year-old female hiker at the 6740-foot level of Mount Baker in Whatcom County. The subject was suffering from a fractured right wrist and possible spinal injury needing an evacuation off the mountain. SEOOs contacted AFRCC to request a helicopter from Navy Whidbey based on the fact there were no local assets available from King or Snohomish Counties. Subject was extracted and taken to the hospital for care.

- On August 13, a “SPOT” beacon was activated inside Yakima County, near the Pacific Crest Trail. Ground assets were requested from nearby Skamania and Lewis Counties, along with requests for helicopter support from King, Snohomish Counties and the AFRCC. The subjects, a 68 year old woman, who was suffering from a broken arm, and her 34 year old son were picked up by a civilian vehicle and transported to Morten General Hospital in Randle.

- 18-3247 On August 26, Mason County opened a search for a missing 25 year old female who fell off of The Steel Bridge on August 25. OMR deployed to recover the body. The body was recovered on August 27 and turned over to the Coroner.
- 18-3251
  - On August 27, Lewis County opened a search for an 83 year-old female berry picker near Packwood. Additional ground searchers, dogs, 4x4's, a helicopter with FLIR and cell phone forensics were requested for August 28 and coordination was accomplished with Thurston, Pierce, Cowlitz, Clark, Skamania, Snohomish, King, Grays Harbor Counties and AFRCC.
  - The subject was located deceased on August 28 and body recovered.

- 18-3300 On August 30, Island County initiated a search for a missing 67-year-old dementia patient. SEOOs coordinated the use of horse-mounted SAR assets from King County. The subject was found and taken to the hospital.
- 18-3325 On August 31, Yakima County requested the use of a helicopter to airlift a subject off Mount Adams, who was complaining about chest pains. The SEOOs contacted AFRCC to coordinate the use of a helicopter. This incident remained open at the end of the month.

*Test information/definitions:*

- **NAWAS:** National Warning System Tests (NAWAS) over the State and Federal circuits. NAWAS connects over 1,800 State and Federal jurisdictions and agencies on the Federal circuit and all counties, some agencies and some tribes on the State circuit. There are four tests a day, two state and two federal, testing 66 drops on two circuits. The number above reflects the four tests a day. Previously the number included the total number of stations contacted during those tests.
- **DOE tests:** Department of Energy Hanford Site has a dedicated phone and fax line into the EOC and they are tested at least weekly. Only the voice phone line numbers are reported here
- **CGS tests:** Columbia Generating Station has a dedicated phone and fax line into the EOC and they are tested at least weekly. Only the voice phone line numbers are reported here.
- **AHAB:** All Hazards Alert Broadcast System is tested daily through the daily function tests, which tests the functional capability of all coastal and Puget Sound siren systems. The voice and tone sirens are tested monthly. The AHAB Siren activates the coastal and Puget Sound voice and tone sirens during tsunami and other hazardous incidents.
- **OPSCAN:** Olympic Peninsula Public Safety Alliance Network (OPSCAN) connects public safety organizations throughout the Olympic Peninsula.
- **STAEN:** The State Agency Emergency Network (STAEN) connects state agency via an 800 MHz radio system.
- **CEMNET:** Comprehensive Emergency Management Network radio connecting all counties and many cities via Zetron Radio Console.
- **King County 800 MHz System** connects the Alert and Warning Center with King County key emergency management and response organizations.
