

**State Enhanced 9-1-1 Advisory Committee
Meeting Minutes, March 19, 2015, Camp Murray, WA**

- I. **Call to Order**
Chair Peggy Fouts called the E911 Advisory Committee (AC) meeting to order at 9:34 a.m.

 - a. **Bylaw Revisions – Mark Layhew/Peggy Fouts**
 - Jim Fosse – technically correct, it leaves openness for the counties. Article II, Section 1.
 - Reference RCW 38.52.530.
 - Bylaw changes were discussed at the September or November of 2014 meeting, to get into scope with RCWs. Bylaws hadn't been reviewed since 2011. Also in line with the Assistant Attorney General's recommendations.
 - Lisa Ernst – please keep in mind the coordinators issues.
 - Discussion ensued; Voting for Chair, Vice Chair; 1:1 or as amended? Vote: 1:1 and 4 year term limit.
 - From 1/3 to simple majority of present members.
 - Section 4: striking – seeking legal opinion.
 - Section 5: generally

 - b. **Action Items – Ziggy Dahl**
 - Wireless Carrier Reports –Distribution process is still under review. AT&T does not have a problem sharing the information. T-Mobile is not set up to do traffic reports in their switching center. Andy will get out AT&T and T-Mobile in April. Sprint and Verizon; Sprint will have to be done in a monthly view. Verizon can do a 90 day review. SECO will turn reports around as soon as received. Sprint says they will provide traffic studies-**OPEN**
 - Fluctuation of taxes statewide - (see handouts). This document will be posted to OneDrive and will be brought to the AC for review in May and November. – **CLOSED.**
 - Legislative Report-Posted to OneDrive. AC needs to accomplish distribution independent of SECO. -**CLOSED**
 - FCC letter on Location Accuracy-Not accomplished due to debate over end over accuracy part. There is concern about the FCC mandating accuracy levels. There are fundamental issues with current accuracy. The current pro-position is being touted by a specific company. Please comment on your own if you'd like to. - **CLOSED**
 - Preserving Reliable 911 Services-WUTC has filed on behalf of the state and available on their website. The SECO will be filing as well.

VII. Subcommittee Reports

a. 911 Communications Subcommittee – Marlys Davis

- **FCC & Telecom Report November 2014 (Refer to handouts)**
 - Comments need to be submitted by counties before Monday on the Reliable 911 Service as Technology Evolves.
 - Rules to Help Emergency Responders Better Locate Wireless 911 Callers; CMRS providers must provide horizontal and vertical locations as well as perform within time constraints.
 - Accuracy testing has improved over the years, refer to Phase II Accuracy Testing handout.
 - Comments due by March 24 on the State Collection and Distribution of 911 and Enhanced 911 Fees and Charges.
- **Interim Text-to-9-1-1**
 - Kitsap has cut over to Text-to-911. Chart with various cutover implementation dates is posted to OneDrive.
- **Collaborative Effort to deal with quality issues off wireless and VoIP 911 calls.**
 - Some of the issues include; transferring, voice quality, etc. Tracing software was placed on all of King County's equipment and issues were traced back to the service providers.
 - NG9-1-1 Call Quality and Routing Issues (see OneDrive for PowerPoint); We are looking for a more coordinated approach. We don't know how big the issue is so we are proposing a summit be held with all stakeholders to address the issues; what has been learned so far and what we don't know about. For instance contacting VoIP providers – how do you contact them? Contact lists are needed. Items to discuss; should we establish procedures, establish forms, best practices, troubleshooting lists, escalation procedures, etc. We will be asking for volunteer PSAPs to install tracing equipment. This could possibly be covered at the June forum in Kennewick. Kenn Moisey at SECO is contact for this issue.

d. Policy Subcommittee – Richard Kirton

- New membership changes Craig Larsen Medium Counties West – Deanna wells to take over. Keeping Tom Shaughnessy as the alternate.
- Rural Counties West position 2 - Karl Hatton replaces Steve Romberg with Jason Fritz as the alternate.
 - i. CPD and operations policies:
Items of concern include Section 3, Item 1: clarification, line items are line by line contracts. Item 2. Operations contract is based on 3 formula elements plus CPD. Recommending removal of wireline/wireless split.

Clarifies operations contract items with in the formulas, can be moved around. Ineligible items; demarcation should be similar to the voice network. Recommending splitting out equipment contract for this year still. All equipment reference has been struck from this policy and added to the equipment policy. CPD Schedule; adding CPD 8 training coordinator cap same as CPD 3. CPD 4; will need to spend more money on GPS. Currently a placeholder has been inserted. CPD 6; data synchronization for preapproved software. TOM SHAUGHNESSY-split on wireline/wireless service has a direct effect to getting some money to zero money. Opposed to the 2 areas of the proposed change. Speaking on behalf of Island County and not as an AC member.

- ii. Equipment Policy-changes relating to eligibility. These will be biennial contracts. Make sure your projects are finished by end of biennium. Changes first paragraph is new, #2-C, #4- will have letter K added. 5-F is new, CPD 6 was added into reimbursement schedule. Quarterly progress report added. B-7.1 Modernization was removed.
- iii. Would prefer to delay voting on policies until review can be done with constituents. Needs to be completed by mid-April. Motion to adopt today as stated with recommendations. Motion seconded. Discussion: Recommend removing fobs as an eligible item. Don't recommend voting today. Comment: Tom Shaughnessy, Rebecca, Marcus, and TCS abstain from voting. A special meeting will be called for voting.

e. Training Subcommittee – Scott Jenkins

- Working on deaf and hard of hearing training. Beta test was done yesterday and was excellent. Advertising will go out for classes coming up. Twelve classes will be done between now and the end of June.

f. GIS Subcommittee – Craig Larsen

- The subcommittee made a number of recommendations to the Policy committee.
- Next meeting is April 16, 2015 at King County.

g. Strategic Planning Subcommittee – Laura Caster

- Continue working on updating document. Expect to have an update by mid-April.

- SECO budget, added back in the 911 fund balance.
- Network billing continues to be a challenge. We're closing in on the issues. We have identified about \$700K dollars to date.

IX. For the Good of the Order

c. APCO/NENA Legislative – Keith Flewelling (New APCO/NENA Chair)

- Current budget is exceeding revenue by 100 million dollars.
- Sunshine committee: There is a lot of support for the 911 portion of the bill. They are talking about splitting the bill apart. The lobbyists for the newspaper will be working with us.
- ESSB 5158, Kelly Smith Act. Requires PSAPs to provide location to Emergency workers upon request, expected to pass.
- Will be in discussions with WUTC about PSAP architecture and funding.
- RFP has been tweaked and redone on advice of the AAG. A special 911 SAAG has been assigned to help us with the RFP to strengthen what were asking for. First target is 1 January 2016, more realistically, 1 July 2016. Current provider contract is extended to 31 December 2015.
- WMD on the 16th of March will change to a 4/10 work schedule working Tuesday's through Friday's with Monday's off. We will work around meeting issues.
